EAPS Award for Population Studies

This Award was initiated by the Council of the European Association for Population Studies (EAPS). The EAPS Award honours ground breaking original contributions to the study of population with far reaching implications for our discipline and our understanding of population dynamics and their consequences. Unique innovative insights such as expressed in a single or several publications, as well as work which spans a longer period can be nominated for the EAPS Award for Population Studies, as can exceptional life time achievements. The Award is granted every two years during the European Population Conference. The Council of EAPS is the Jury for this Award.

The first EAPS Award was presented to dr Frans J. Willekens at the European Population Conference 2014 which convened in Budapest from 25-28 June.

2014 Laureate Frans Willekens

Frans Willekens (MPIDR) had the honour of accepting the 2014 EAPS Award. The laudation named Frans Willekens "an inquisitive, open, supportive, creatively pragmatic, unassuming, problem-solving, productive and immensely hospitable scholar, teacher and research administrator. He has made seminal research contributions to multistate modeling including multiregional demography: he has pioneered mathematical models, methods of parameter estimation from incomplete or defective data, and strategies for forecasting."
