

4. Report of the fifth EAPS General Assembly of the European Association For Population Studies, Milan (Italy), 6 September 1995

The fifth General Assembly of EAPS convened on 6 September 1995 in Milan (Italy) during the European Population Conference 1995 (4-8 September). Nearly 100 members attended this Assembly.

4.1. Opening EAPS Council

President Charlotte Höhn opened the fifth General Assembly at 18.50 hours, welcoming all participating members and especially these who joined EAPS recently.

4.2. From Paris to Milan: overview of EAPS' scientific activities 1991-1995

Charlotte Höhn presented a bird's-eye view of all scientific activities in which EAPS participated c.q. granted its auspices between the Paris and the Milan Conference. The Quételet meeting 1991 (Gembloux, Belgium) was mentioned, together with the 1991 NIAS meeting on demographic consequences of International migration (Wassenaar, Netherlands), the 1992 Väestöliitto meeting on revival of ageing societies (Helsinki, Finland), the 1992 BiB meeting on demographic implications of marital status (Bonn, Germany), the 1992 Summer course on demographic perspectives on living arrangements (Wassenaar, Netherlands), the 1992 European seminar international migrations as a factor of security and cooperation in Europe and in the Mediterranean region (Rome, Italy) the 1992 CBGS meeting on reconstituted families in Europe (Brussels, Belgium), the 1993 NESTOR meeting on living arrangements and social networks of older adults(The Hague, Netherlands), the 1993 BiB meeting on population-relevant policies in Europe (Wiesbaden, Germany), the 1994 workshop L'analyse démographique au service I 'enterprise et de la gestion publique (Rende-Consenza, Italy), the 1994 Louvain-la-Neuve meeting on life tables in Europe (Louvain-la-Nuevo, Belgium), the 1995 NIAS Study Centre on population ageing in Europe (Wassenaar, Netherlands), and the 1995 seminar 011 morbidity and mortality data (Ankara, Turkey). Furthermore the the yearly *International summer school in demography and geo-demography* (Prague and Malá Skála Castle, Czech Republic) was mentioned as well as the European observatory for population education and information.

The President concluded her overview in thanking all institutions and members that look part in organizing these events.
